




Motivation for the Project

- Discussions at AIR between Ashford and HERI
- No good national survey option for online learning
- Pilot project to adapt CIRP survey for the online learning experience











CIRP Conceptual Framework

- ☐ Student experience is comprehensive, multifaceted, and inter-related, not focused on one or two issues
- ☐ Look at cognitive and affective domains
- ☐ Collect data that is:
 - Behavioral (what students do, i.e., study, interact, etc.)
 - Psychological (attitudes, values, self-concept)
 - Environmental (campus climate, residence type)







Astin's I-E-O Model

ENVIRONMENT

YFCY/DLE/CSS

(e.g., residence, interactions with peers and faculty, curricular and co-curricular experiences)





INPUT

CIRP Freshman Survey

(previous academic performance,
financial concerns,
expectations, degree aspirations,
self-concept in high school, race, sex)



OUTCOME

YFCY/DLE/CSS
(gains in college, satisfaction with college, retention, post-college plans)







The First Year is a Big Deal

- ☐ Results from the Your First College Year Survey (YFCY) offer a window into the first-year experience, providing important information on your students':
 - Adjustment to college
 - Academic outcomes and experiences
 - Co-curricular experiences
 - Satisfaction
 - Overall growth









Changes made for the YFCY-OL

- ☐ All questions that related to a physical campus were removed
 - "How often have you been a guest in a professor's home?"
- ☐ Some questions were modified:
 - I see myself as part of the campus community
 - I see myself as part of the college community









Changes made for the YFCY-OL

- Some questions specific to the online environment were added:
 - How often did you respond to classmates' posts in online discussion forums?
 - Please rate your ability to learn on your own









☐ Ashford University

- Private-For-Profit
- Two Modalities
 - —Online (50 starts a year)
 - —Campus (3 starts a year)



- Associate's (online only), Bachelor's, and Master's (online only)
- Colleges:
 - Business and Professional Studies
 - Education
 - Health, Human Services, and Science
 - Liberal Arts









Who Are the Students in the Survey?



- ☐ Standard Criteria for Inclusion Applies
 - Email address on file
 - No Do Not Call/Do Not Contact flag
- ☐ Additional Criteria
 - Online students only
 - New to Ashford University







Who Are the Students in the Survey?




- ☐ Challenge: Ashford has 50 start dates every year.
- ☐ Solution: Select students starting in a given quarter.
 - Spring: January March
 - Summer: April June
 - Fall: July September
 - Winter: October December







Who Are the Students in the Survey?



- ☐ Challenge: Students take classes one a time, for five weeks at a time. They can also take breaks.
- Solution: Choose students starting between one and three classes in the quarter.








Selected Survey Results

- ☐ How do online adult learners compare to other students?
 - National Comparison statistic
 includes all participating
 institutions for that year.
 - Institution statistic









So What?

- ☐ Statistical differences exist, but not for all questions
- Should IR professionals study survey results from online students separate from campus students?
- What contributes to the differences between modalities?
- ☐ Can one modality be a better "fit" for a student?
- Would the results at your institution show similar differences?
