#### University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES)

- an biennial online survey of all UC undergraduates
- 38% response rate systemwide in Spring 2006 (58,047 respondents)

   Evaluation of student services and academic experiences





- Do self-reported outcomes differ by ethnic group?









# Campus Environment: Friendly or Hostile?



# Supplemental Slides

## Summary by Ethnic Groups

- African American students feel entitled or comfortable expressing their political and religious differences but have the most negative perceptions of their campus climate.
- African Americans have the high levels of campus involvement, highest change as a result of interacting with diverse students, and interaction with faculty despite the fact that identify most with their own ethnic group who is in the minority.
- Chicano Latino students, while not as extreme outliers as African Americans, show a similar pattern of negative perceptions of campus climate.
- White students report the least identification with their ethnic group and the fewest opportunities to explore their cultural identities.
- API students report the lowest level of interaction with faculty.
