Importance of Transfer

- Approximately 55% of CSU graduates and 30% of UC graduates were community college transfers.
- Transfer is the most common declared goal of first-time students enrolling in our system.
- Transfer related outcomes are the most frequent outcome in Scorecard Completion Rate.
- Transfer continues to be a central mission of community colleges, despite expanding goals.

Transfer Methodologies

- Volume of Transfers Number of students transferring in a particular year.
 - Snapshot in time
- <u>Transfer Rates</u> Percentage of transfer seeking students who transfer within # years.
 - Cohorts of students
- <u>Transfer Ready</u> Completed Math, English, and 60 UC/CSU transferable units.
 - CCC metric, transfer proxy

Volume of Transfer (CSU/UC)

 Number of students transferring to CSU and UC is always captured based on their reports and their methodology.



Transfer Rates

- Methodology developed in 2001 by CCCCO & Transfer Data Technical Workgroup (TDTW).
- Published and peer reviewed by Bahr, Hom and Perry in 2005 and refined over the years.
- Student educational goal is not reliable indicator of intent (change mind, exaggerate, updated)
- Course taking patterns based on units and types of courses is used to establish student intent.

 Percentage of first-time students with at least 12 units and attempted transfer level math or English who transferred after X years (6 years) to a public or private four-year institution.



Bachelor's Degree Earned by CCC Transfer Students

Cohort: Scorecard Completion cohort of 2007-08, matched to NSC data via SSN

- Students intend on earning AA/AS or transfer
 Outcome: BA earned =< 6 years of starting CCC
- Graduated from a 4-year institution with the degree title indicating BA

Finding: 8.0% earned a Bachelor's degree

Bachelor's Degree Earned by CCC Transfer Students

- Methodological Limitations:
 - Using graduate/credential data from National Student Clearinghouse
 - unstandardized data fields & unknown reliability
 - Six-year from entrance into CC, not enough time to observe graduation from 4-year college

Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs)


Background

- Senate Bill 1440 required CCC/CSU to create Associate Degrees for Transfer.
- Provides clear, statewide curricular pathways that CCC students follow to transfer to CSU.
- Students enter CSU with a junior status, with no more than 60 additional units to complete a BA/BS.

Expected Outcomes of ADTs

- 1. Increase the number of students receiving ADTs.
- 2. Increase the share of students transferring to CSU with an ADT.
- 3. Increase the percent of students earning an Associate degree prior to transfer.



ADT Awards as % of All Associate Degrees Earned





Increase share of CSU transfers with an ADT & increase % of students earning a degree before transfer

- Unable to identify students whose intention is to transfer → Use Scorecard transfer/degree cohort
- The Scorecard completion metric takes too long to evaluate changes (6 years) → Use a shorter follow up (4 years)
- The Scorecard completion metric includes transfers to any 4-year institutions as outcomes → Use NSC match

Percent of Students Transferred to CSU with ADT or AA/AS







HOW STUDENTS QUALIFY FOR THE AGREEMENT

(A) Students who obtain a Transfer-level Associate
 Degree*(60 units) with a 2.5 or higher GPA are guaranteed
 admission with junior standing to participating HBCUs.

OR

- (B) Students may also opt to transfer with 30 or more UC or CSU transferable units and a 2.5 or higher GPA. Units will be accepted for general education, pre major or elective units.
- Includes Data Agreement

HBCU Data Agreement

- Student descriptives and process measures, such as course completion, term persistence and course of study.
- Success of students is measured by achieved outcomes and includes degrees conferred, time to completion, and continuation to an advanced education.
- Colleges provide the CCCCO with a written summary of the results of the analysis annually.
